It just takes a bit of effort and a little patience. Streaming services are getting pricey if you hate paying for TV, then you're probably calculated the annual price of services such as Netflix or Hulu. As it turns out, a subscription to Netflix and Hulu will cost you over \$200 a year, and the extras will only bring that number higher. Given the current cost of streaming services, the annual price increases on Netflix and Amazon Prime, and the addition of new services such as Disney, the future looks bleak or at least expensive. We tend to think of these services as an escape from cable, but they are starting to look very similar to cable companies. Is there a way out of streaming services? Fortunately, you don't have to pay for Netflix or Hulu to get an online TV fix. There are many ways to watch TV online for free, and some of them make you wonder why someone pays \$12.99 a month for a subscription streaming service. Borrow Someone's Login When it comes to sharing accounts, streaming services are pretty weak. In fact, most streaming services encourage sharing of credentials, at least within the family, with individual user profiles and multiplayer pricing plans. You ask a friend for information about logging in, add a profile to your account and go to the city. You can also borrow cable input from a friend or family member to stream content directly from TV networking websites such as FOX or HBO. Some cable services, such as DirecTV, even have their own streaming portals. It's crazy how a single username and password can bring you so much free content. Piggybacking on a friend or family member streaming or cable subscription can save a lot of money, but in the end, someone will still pay that bill. If you are trying to ditch streaming services and ghost cable completely, then you will have to find another way into the world of free television. This may be against the terms of service of some streaming services, but others encourage you to share with family members. The best free streaming sites: Pluto TV and Crackle If you won't (or can't) borrow someone's login information, then you'll have to find a free TV in the wild. Fortunately, there are many streaming websites that offer free content, and most of them have multiple classes of shows and movies. The most popular free streaming sites are Pluto TV, which offers more than a hundred live channels featuring movies and TV shows, and Sony Crackle, which provides a variety of TV shows and movies for streaming on-demand. Pluto and there's advertising, of course, but so is cable TV and you pay for it! You can watch them in your web browser, in your smartphone or tablet app, or even on your Roku TV or similar device. You can also broadcast free shows from public broadcast networks such as PBS or BBC (but you will need a VPN to watch the show with the BBC because the service is exclusive to Europe). Dust off your library card As strange as it sounds, you can stream shows and movies from your local library. All you need is a library card and website like OverDrive or Hoopla. Your public library is guaranteed to have a wide range of shows and movies, enough that you can forget about streaming services completely. And you can forget that Disney subscriptions for a while, because most libraries carry a decent selection of Disney movies (well, classic Disney movies). If you are trying to save money, these websites are a savior. You can use them to borrow digital copies of books, comics, music and audiobooks from your public library. And don't worry, you may not even have to go to the physical library to apply for a library card. Just Google the name of your local library card along with the word apply. Your local library offers other free digital content, too, from e-books and audiobooks to online newspapers. And, if you're willing to go to the library in person, you can find a good selection of Blu-rays, DVDs and CDs you can take for free. Whether you're a fan of Google or Apple, iTunes and the Google Play store offer movies to purchase through those accounts that become your own. New releases cost about \$20; At about the same price the DVD will cost, although a digital copy cannot be lost or damaged. Of course, buying individual titles to own is more expensive than paying a small fee for a streaming service and gaining access to piles of content. iTunes and Google Play also offer movies to rent at a lower price. Rent gives you the opportunity to watch the movie once in a 30-day period and 24 hours to finish it after you clicked to play. These options are also great for switching between devices, as iTunes and Google Play will remember where you are in the movie if you're interrupted and want to switch from YOUR TV to tablet or smartphone. Amazon offers movies to buy or rent at the same prices as Apple and Google, and you don't need a Prime membership to access this service.
